**Format:** All classes will be held according to the most recent AVA rules and/or AVA Guidelines, unless stated differently in the Class List. Review the Class List carefully for descriptions and criteria of all unrecognized classes. Please be sure to check the current AVA Rules & Guidelines before submitting entries. An awards ceremony will be held at the end of each competition day. Ribbons will be awarded for at least 1<sup>st</sup> through 7<sup>th</sup> overall, except as noted in the Class List.

**AVA Recognition:** Per Section VII, Part B of the AVA Standing Rules (page 27-28)

“For Recognized Competitions, entries are limited to Registered Clubs and Individuals. Clubs, coaches, longeurs and vaulters must be Registered Members of the AVA in good standing as of the closing date of entries. This rule does not apply to foreign teams or individuals” [Emphasis added.]

Event Memberships will be accepted with the appropriate fee. *Please see Summary of Fees - Form S2*

**Changes and Additions:** Changes and additions to classes will be allowed, but will incur a \$5 fee per change/add in. Fest management reserves the right to split and/or combine Division B classes based on the number of entries received.

**Draw and Order of Go:** The draw for Order of Go will be held beginning at 2:00 PM on Sunday, April 7<sup>th</sup>, in Woodinville, WA. Representatives from each entered club are also invited for a lunch potluck preceding the draw. A “Tentative Order of Go” will be prepared and e-mailed out as soon as possible following the drawing. The “Final Order of Go” will be included in the Coaches’ packets Saturday morning.

**Arena:** 80'x180' indoor, ~20'+ ceiling

**Stabling:** Overnight stabling is available on site at The Back Forte EC. The cost of the stabling is \$50 per horse and includes both Friday and Saturday nights. Most stalls are 12'x12'. Daily haul-in is permitted with payment of a \$30 “haul in fee” (\$15 x 2 days).

**Food:** Concessions will be available on site. Many sit down and fast food restaurants are within 15 minutes drive.

**Medal Tests:** Reasonable efforts will be made to accommodate medal testing subject to the availability of judge and arena time. All medal test fees and application filings are the responsibility of clubs and/or individuals taking medal tests. *Please contact the show manager for more information.*

### Important Show Information:

1. **Coaches' Check-in & Meeting is Saturday morning at 8 AM.** Specific location at Back Forte EC will be announced and/or posted. Coaches' packets will be available at that time provided that all paperwork is in order. At least one representative from each club, preferably the Coach of Record, should attend the Coaches Meeting.
2. **Both hold harmless and medical release forms must be signed and returned with entries.** Vaulters without these forms will NOT be permitted to participate. Late releases will incur a \$5 fee per participant. Back Forte Equestrian Center and Show Management will not be responsible for any damages, losses or injuries during the competition.
3. Classes will be **run in the "Final Order of Go"**. Classes may be run early. Please monitor the progress of the competition and be on deck and ready to go in your scheduled slot.
4. **Music:** Vaulters should provide their own music, on **Audio CD format CD-Rs** (no MP3 CD or commercial CDs). Music must be clearly marked with Club, Vaulter and Class Names. Music should be delivered to the music director at the start of each competition day. Show Management is not responsible for music left overnight. The preferred CD layout is with Run-in on track 1, Compulsories on track 2, and Freestyles in the Order of Go. A team member or parent should be next to the music director during each go to make sure there are no mishaps. Backup disks are advisable. Music checks will be available 30 minutes before the start of competition each day.
5. No vaulter practice (on the horse) will be allowed on-site before Saturday. Working horses Friday evening will likely be permitted, but an additional fee may apply.
6. Dogs are not permitted on the competition site. Please plan to leave them at home.
7. The judge has the right to excuse from the competition any horse which is uneven, unlevel, in bad condition or which shows signs of discomfort, and/or any horse which is behaving in an unsafe manner which may endanger the safety of the vaulters.
8. Management is not responsible for the decisions of the judge.
9. Management reserves the right to correct any error or make any changes in the program or class list.
10. Show management has/is applying for AVA Recognition. Updates regarding AVA Recognized status will be announced by e-mail to the AVARegionIII@YahooGroups.com mailing list and to other interested clubs and individuals. *Please contact the show manager for more information.*
11. Emergency Medical Service staff will be on-call and/or on-site during the competition.
12. All participants are required to be members of Region III of the AVA. *See Form R1.* Participants who reside in other AVA Regions or registered with EVA clubs are exempt from this requirement, though the Region III Competition Fee(s) still apply.

**Composite Teams:** Coaches of composite teams should review the registration requirements given in the AVA's Standing Rules, Section VIII.B.7. Any AVA Composite Team Forms must be submitted with the corresponding team entry form (Form A2 or B3). Composite Team entry and registration form(s) should be submitted together with the Coach or Record's club's other entries.

**Photo / Video Sharing:** One of the best ways that we can help grow our sport is to make photos and video of our events easy to find and available for use by those that support vaulting. Every participant is asked to help achieve this by allowing those that take photos and video to share those images. Participants and spectators that take photos or video and would like to share them on sites like Flickr.com or YouTube.com are asked to attribute them by using the following tags: "VoNW-SF-07", "Vaulting" and the name of the Club(s) shown. These tags will help us find them. Also please use a Creative Commons Attribution- ShareAlike License so that they can be used to promote our future events and support our clubs.

### **Important Facility Information:**

- 1) Back Forte Equestrian Center is a non-smoking facility. Please respect this rule by smoking only in your own vehicle and by using your own ashtray.
- 2) Please leave all pets at home.
- 3) Bicycles, tricycles, and motor scooters tend to scare horses and should also be left at home.
- 4) Vaulting competitors, coaches, and longeurs will have access to the large indoor arena and stall area. One warm-up ring and the competition ring will be in this barn. Spectator seating will be set up in this area also.
- 5) Riding is allowed on the premises. Appropriate riding attire (boots and helmets) are required.
- 6) Additional horse warm-up is available in the outdoor arenas
- 7) Use of facilities in the small Boarders Barn are not allowed.

**Since Back Forte E.C. has other clients and their boarded horses using the facility during our Fest, we want to make sure we don't infringe in any way upon their use of the facility. Do not touch any horse without the permission of the owner. The Fest committee also asks that parents keep their small children with them and supervised at all times. Vaulters will be expected to keep running, loud noises, and youthful exuberance in check.**

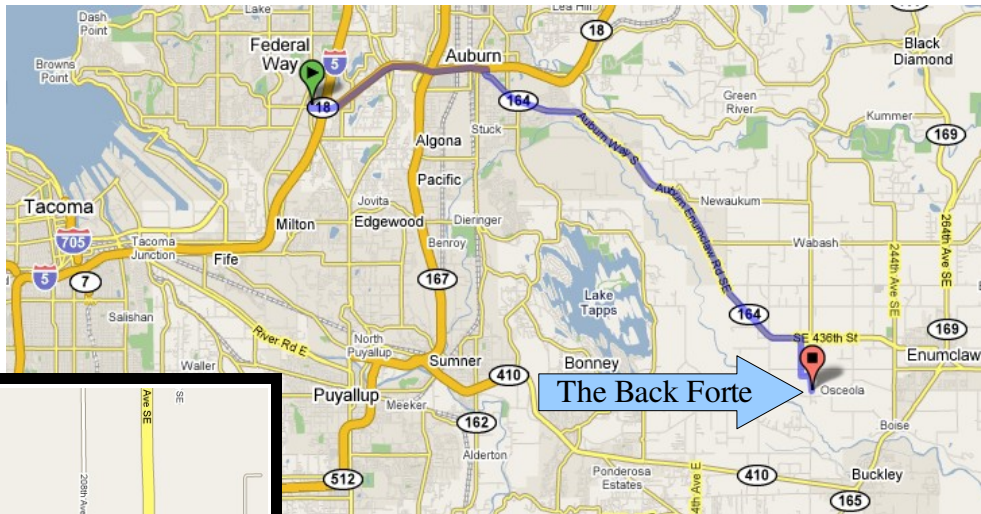

## Entry Instructions:

1. Carefully review this entire packet, especially the Class List, **and** the current AVA Rules and Guidelines. The current AVA Rules and Guidelines are available through the members section of the AVA website at: <http://www.americanvaulting.org/members/memberservices/rulebook.shtml>
2. Complete forms A1, A2, B1, B2 and B3. Print or make photocopies as needed. Be sure to include each vaulter's and longeur's AVA membership number. For Barrel Classes use the corresponding B1, B2 and/or B3 form(s) and leave the horse and longeur blanks empty. Make sure to specify the correct Class Number.
3. Complete form H1. Arena space at the Back Forte EC will be very limited during the competition. Thus signing up for a stall(s) for use when your horse(s) are not scheduled to compete is recommended.
4. Complete form S1, "Summery of Class Entries and Class Fees".
  - Enter the number of vaulters in column A for each class and if indicated the number of entries [teams, pairs, etc.].
  - Compute the fees for each class by multiplying the number of vaulters by the fee per vaulter, column A x column B, and record in the last column.
  - Compute the Total Class Fees by adding up the fees for each class. Also record this amount on Line 5 of Form S2.
5. Complete form S2.
  - Line 1 is based on the total number [head count] of vaulters & participating longeurs entered. *This fee does not apply to coaches or longeurs that are not entering the competition ring.*
  - Line 2, Region III Fees, is based on the total number [head count] of vaulters entered.
  - Per the AVA Standing Rules, Section VIII, Part B, paragraph 6 "For all Recognized Competitions, a \$5.00 surcharge per vaulter will be assessed by and paid to the AVA." Thus the AVA Vaulter Fees, line 3, must be paid for for each vaulter entered, including foreign teams and individuals.
  - Line 4 is based on the number of vaulters, longeurs and coaches participating in the competition that are not AVA Members as of the Close of Entries. *See AVA Recognition above. This rule, and fee, does not apply to foreign teams or individuals.*
  - Line 5 is the "Total Class Fees" from Form S1.
  - Line 6 is based on the number of horses and stalls / haul-ins listed on form H1.
  - Line 7 is the sum of lines 1 through 6.
6. Complete form S3, listing all vaulters and longeurs participating in the competition. Also on Form S3 record the contact information for your club's Coach of Record and Contact Person. The Coach of Record must be an AVA Member, AVA Event Member or foreign individual. If the Coach of Record is also the Club Contact Person, leave the Club Contact Person information blank.
7. Have each of your vaulters, longeurs and coaches complete and sign copies of forms M1, R1 & R2.
8. Make copies of all your completed entry forms, (A1, A2, B1, B2, B3, H1, S1, S2, S3, M1, R1 & R2), for your club's records. It's a good idea to bring your copies with you to the show.
9. Collect entry fees from all your vaulters and submit a single check for all the entry fees from your club. Please make your check payable to **Cascade Vaulters** in US Dollars. *Contact Fest Manager for on line payment details.*  
**Tip:** *You can also use copies of forms S1, S2 & S3 to help compute the amount of entry fees each vaulter must pay.*
10. On or before the close of entries date mail or ship the original hard copies of your entry forms. Be sure to enclose your check and all your release forms (M1, R1 & R2). Also you should obtain a proof of mailing / shipment certificate, preferably with a tracking number or delivery conformation number. Record the Service and Tracking / Delivery Conformation # information on your copy of form S3.

Please pay close attention to the description of the classes before entering your vaulter(s). Be sure to consult the current version of your AVA Rule Book for the rules pertaining to the Recognized Classes. The Judge will be using the AVA Rules, Guidelines and the following Class Descriptions to judge this competition. Note that the page references given are from the edition printed in March 2005.

## Mounted Classes

### DIVISION A

1, ABCD	<u>Gold Individual Event</u>	Per AVA Rules for Vaulting, Chapter III, Article 301, page 53-57. AVA Recognized National Class.
2, ABCD	<u>Silver Individual Event</u>	Per AVA Rules for Vaulting, Chapter III, Article 301, page 53-57. No gold medalists allowed. AVA Recognized National Class.
3, ABC	<u>Bronze Individual Event</u>	Per AVA Rules for Vaulting, Chapter III, Article 305, pages 57-59. No silver or gold medalists allowed. AVA Recognized National Class.
4, AB	<u>Copper Individual Event</u>	: Per AVA Rules for Vaulting, Chapter III, Article 308-310, pages 60-62. No canter medalists allowed. AVA Recognized National Class.
5, AB	<u>Individual Trot Event</u>	Compulsories and Freestyle. Per AVA Guidelines, Chapter XIV, Article 1401-1043, pages 88-90. Unrated, novice pin and/or trot medal holders are okay; no canter medalists.
6, AB	<u>C Team</u>	– Per AVA Rule Book, Chapter II, pages 48-53 AVA. Recognized National Class.
7, AB	<u>Open Team Two-Phase Event (Canter)</u>	– Per AVA Rules for Vaulting, Chapter V, pages 63-65. AVA Recognized National Class.
8, AB	<u>Trot Team</u>	– Per AVA Rules for Vaulting, Chapter II, pages 48-53. AVA Recognized National Class.

## Mounted Classes

### DIVISION B

9, AB Preliminary Trot Compulsories & Freestyle: According to current AVA Guidelines, Chapter XV, Article 1502 & 1503, page 90-91. An assisted mount is allowed but receives a zero. No trot or canter medalists are allowed to compete in this class. Novice pins okay.

10, AB Novice Walk Compulsories & Freestyle: Assisted Mounts are MANDATORY and are NOT scored. The compulsory exercises that will be preformed in this class are: Basic Seat, Flag, Mill, Scissors, Stand and Flank. All compulsory exercises are preformed per AVA Rules. Spotters are okay, but no assistance is allowed. (Assistance will result in a zero for the exercise that was assisted.) A one-minute freestyle routine. Vaulters MUST STAY in contact with the horse (no leaps or hops to feet, etc. allowed – elimination). Judged on Content and Performance (See Article 1403.2, Page 89 for criteria)

11, AB Tiny Tot Compulsories & Freestyle: 6 years old or younger. Assisted Mounts are MANDATORY, and are NOT scored. Spotters are okay, but no assistance with the actual exercises. (Assistance results in a zero for the exercise that was assisted). The compulsory exercises that will be preformed in this class are: Basic Seat, Flag, Mill, Scissors and Stand. The dismount (after performing the stand) is a simple leg over the neck – NOT scored (and spotters are allowed to assist in the landing). Compulsories are otherwise as per AVA Rules. A maximum one-minute freestyle routine. Vaulters MUST STAY in contact with the horse (no leaps or hops to feet, etc. allowed – elimination). Judged on Content and Performance (See Article 1403.2, Page 89 for criteria) All participants in this class will receive ribbons.

12 Advanced Canter Pairs – Open to all vaulters. Per Chapter XII, in AVA Guidelines, page 86-87. TWO MINUTES.

13 Preliminary Canter Pairs – Open to all vaulters except those who hold higher than a bronze medal. Per Chapter XII, in AVA Guidelines, page 86-87. TWO MINUTES.

14 Trot Pairs – Open to all trot vaulters; no canter medalists allowed. Per Chapter XVI, in AVA Guidelines, page 92. NINETY SECONDS.

15, AB 4-6 Vaulters Canter Team Compulsories & Freestyle: Compulsories judged per AVA Rules, Article 203, Team Compulsories, pages 50-51. Freestyle can be preformed at any gait; 4 minute team freestyle. Freestyle judged per AVA Rules Article 204, Team Freestyle, pages 51-53.

16, AB Trot Team 2-Phase – Per AVA Rule Book, Chapter XVII, page 93.

17 Shannon Class: Freestyle Routine (1 minute) to “surprise” music. Participants will have one listen-through to their selected music, and will then perform a freestyle that will be judged on artistry, originality and music interpretation. Participants will be able to listen to their music at lunch, and the Shannon Class will be scheduled for later that day. No ribbons will be awarded for this class, as the proceeds from this class are donated to Children’s Hospital in Seattle, Washington in the memory of Shannon Balkema.

18, WTC      Preliminary Technical Test: Purpose of this new class is to introduce vaulters, coaches & judges to the composition, performance and scoring of technical tests. Performed, Judged & Scored per AVA Rules, Article 304 [Gold Technical Test, page 56 & 57] EXCEPT:

- Open to all vaulters not holding an AVA Gold medal (or international equivalent).
- Preliminary Technical test may be performed at Walk, Trot or Canter. Vaulters holding canter medal(s) (or international equivalent) MUST preform at Canter. Vaulters holding trot medal(s) (or international equivalent) MUST preform at Trot or Canter.
- Music with words or lyrics is NOT allowed.
- Class **will** be divided into separate Walk, Trot and/or Canter divisions. Assisted Mounts are MANDATORY at walk and are NOT scored.
- Class may be divided into separate Men's and Woman's divisions.
- The three (3) Preliminary Technical Exercises shall be:
  - Balance: “**Sideways Knees**”, facing inside or outside on the horse's back, up to three point (3.0) deduction from the exercise score for holding the pad, surcingle and/or grips
  - Strength: “**Wheelbarrow**”, static push-up position (frontways down) supported by both arms and both legs, legs closed, hands may be placed and/or holding symmetrically on the pad, surcingle or grips. [see illustration FEI Guidelines for Judges 4th edition 2005, page 70]
  - Suppleness: “**Frontways Needle**”, both hands holding grips, either leg extended

Please specify Walk [W], Trot [T] or Canter [C] for each vaulter on Form B1 when signing up.

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29              Green Horse Class: Your chance to get your inexperienced horse into a competition like setting. You have 3 minutes to lunge your horse with or without vaulters. The judge will give comments about how the horse is behaving, his quality of gaits, his acceptance of the aids, etc. 3 MINUTES.

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30, AB              EVA Canter D: According to current EVA of BC Rules for [Canadian] Division D at canter. See the “EVA of BC Rules” and the “EVA of BC Handbook for Coaches and Judges”.

31, AB              EVA Trot D: According to current EVA of BC Rules for [Canadian] Division D at trot. See the “EVA of BC Rules” and the “EVA of BC Handbook for Coaches and Judges”.

32, AB              EVA Walk D: According to current EVA of BC Rules for [Canadian] Division D at walk. See the “EVA of BC Rules” and the “EVA of BC Handbook for Coaches and Judges”.

**Note for EVA Division C Vaulters:** Please plan to preform full compulsories and enter classes 4, AB Copper [Canter]; 9, AB Preliminary Trot; or 10, AB Novice Walk.

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34              Preliminary Walk Pairs – No canter medalists allowed. Judged per Chapter XVI, in AVA Guidelines, page 92, except at walk. Assisted Mounts are MANDATORY and are NOT scored. NINETY SECONDS.

35              Novice Walk Pairs – No trot or canter medalists allowed. Judged per Chapter XVI, in AVA Guidelines, page 92, except at walk. Assisted Mounts are MANDATORY and are NOT scored. Both vaulters MUST STAY in contact with the horse (no leaps, lifts or hops to feet, etc. allowed – elimination). Spotters are okay, but no assistance is allowed. (Assistance will result in a zero for the exercise that was assisted.) NINETY SECONDS.

## Barrel Classes

### DIVISION B

#### **Barrel Class Assignment:**

Since the skill level and performance aptitude of barrel freestyle routines varies widely and doesn't necessarily follow a vaulters medal testing experience, Coaches are asked to use their best discretion when entering vaulters in barrel classes.

Typically older and more experienced vaulters (and those with significant gymnasts experience) should be placed in the Advanced Classes. Advanced vaulters usually have routines with a high overall DOD and are adept at performing smooth transitions visibly interpreting their music. Beginner and 1<sup>st</sup> Year Classes are typically reserved for younger less experienced vaulters with lower overall DOD, mostly static exercises and mainly rough / blocky transitions. The Intermediate classes are intended for vaulters between Beginner and Advanced levels. Intermediate freestyle routines generally have a few difficult (high DOD) exercises and several rough transitions.

Show management reserves the right to combine and/or split individual and pairs barrel classes along any lines, including but not limited to: scores in barrel or other classes, age, height, years of vaulting experience, etc.. Before the start of competition individual vaulters or pairs may be reassigned to a different barrel class level, with their coaches consent, by show management to preserve the intended distribution of scores in each barrel class.

Comments, suggestions and feedback about barrel class assignments is both welcome and appreciated.

**Trampoline:** For all barrel classes one trampoline will be allowed. Vaulters must have their coach's permission and should practice with a trampoline before coming to the competition.

- 21 Beginner Barrel Freestyle: Per AVA Guidelines, Chapter XIII, Article 1302, page 88, EXCEPT:
- Sixty (60) second Freestyle routine
  - *See Barrel Class Assignment information above.*
- 22 1<sup>st</sup> Year Barrel Freestyle: Per AVA Guidelines, Chapter XIII, Article 1302, page 88, EXCEPT:
- Sixty (60) second Freestyle routine
  - Vaulters may NOT have competed on horse or barrel before May 1, 2006.
  - All participants in this class will receive ribbons.
  - *See Barrel Class Assignment information above.*
- 23 Advanced Barrel Pairs: Ninety (90) second Pairs Freestyle routine. Vaulters may be the same or opposite gender. *See Barrel Class Assignment information above.* Judged on:

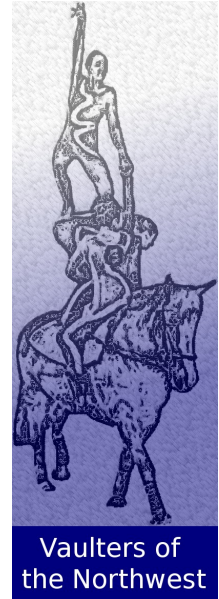

As our sport grows in the Pacific Northwest there is an ever increasing demand for opportunities to practice, perform and compete, while still keeping club dues and events fees affordable for a typical family.
